#### The Rector writes....

"As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never cease."

Genesis 8:22

Harvest time is upon us once again - but for the Church it is going to be a rather strange Harvest. We keep saying 'because of Covid-19 things are different' - and that is true, but for us as a Church we won't have our usual Harvest Thanksgiving Services (details of what we are doing can be found on next page).

The smells and displays of Harvest Thanksgiving in St. Andrew's and in Bush Protestant Hall will just not be the same this year. However, does this mean that the Harvest has not taken place? Of course it has. Scripture reminds us that in God's faithfulness of fulfilling His promise that "As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest... will never cease". For this, we have a lot to be thankful. As hymn 39 describes "For the fruits of His creation, Thanks be to God!"

In order for there to be a harvest, there has to be preparation. The ground has to be prepared, the seed sown, watered and nurtured as it grows, and then the produce appears ready for Harvesting. This is not unlike the work of the Church. It is our responsibility to spiritually prepare the ground, sow the seed, and water and nurture, all in preparation for the Great Harvest. This Harvest is when Jesus will return.

During the past number of months the way in which we prepare, sow and nurture has been very different to how we 'normally' do it, but that doesn't mean that this work has stopped. In fact it is far from it. The way in which we work as a Church may be different, but the work continues. The way we communicate the Gospel Message has changed, but the message has remained the same.

Jesus is the Lord of the Harvest and He has promised that He will return. Just like the farmer gathers the crops, Jesus will gather everyone who has accepted Him as their Saviour and bring them to Heaven. This is an event that we cannot stop, and that we will not miss. The question remains - When Jesus returns will you be gathered by Him or left behind?

Even so, Lord quickly come, to thy final harvest home Gather thou thy people in, free from sorrow, free from sin; There forever purified, in thy presence to abide: Come with all thine angels come, raise the glorious harvest home.

#### Bible Sunday 25th October 2020

As we acknowledge Bible Sunday this month, it's a good opportunity to ask the question: **why should I** read the Bible?


The Bible is the world's best-selling book of all time. However, it isn't one book, but a library of 66 books, composed by some 44 writers over a period of 1500

years in a range of literature including history, poetry, prophecy, letters and apocalyptic (end times). Despite having a number of different writers, the Bible claims one author: God himself!

This is the basis of the unity of its message and authoritative claim to be the primary way by which God speaks to us: 'All Scripture is Godbreathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work' (2 Timothy 3:16). The Bible is inspired ('the word of God in the words of men') and presents itself as a manual for life, equipping us to live for God in every aspect of our lives. We also have the promise of the Holy Spirit to guide us in applying the words to our lives: 'the Spirit will guide you into all truth' (John 16:13).

However, the Bible could also be described as a *love letter* from God, as He uses it to deepen our relationship with him. As Jesus said: *'You diligently study the Scriptures because you think that by them you possess eternal life. These are the Scriptures that testify about me'* (John 5:39,40). Christians follow a person not a book, and the Scriptures are intended to help us to know Jesus better.

At her coronation the Queen was given a Bible with the words 'the most precious thing this world affords'. Does this reflect our own attitude to the Bible?



The **Bible** is a collection of books that took over 2,000 years to write! The books were written by many different people, all helped and inspired by God. The Bible has books about:





#### Who authorised the Bible?

**Question:** If it was the Church that finally decided which books should be included in the Bible, then isn't the Church the top authority?

<u>Answer:</u> No; the Bible produced the Church, not the Church the Bible. This is the real issue: what caused a book to be accepted within the 'Canon' of Scripture? (Greek: *kanon,* 'standard' or 'rule').

#### As far as the Old Testament was concerned:

- 1. Books that were recognised by Jesus Christ as infallible 'Scripture' could not be broken (Matthew 5:18). In John 10:35 Jesus didn't have to explain what He meant by 'Scripture', though elsewhere He did refer to its different categories (law, prophets, psalms) as pointing to Himself (Luke 24:44; Matthew 24:37). All was to be believed and obeyed.
- 2. Books that were recognised by God's people because of their impact. God's people will always recognise His voice (John 10:27). Jesus clashed with the Pharisees for adding their traditions to the Scripture; yet all were agreed that the Old Testament Scriptures were God's word.
- 3. Books that were recognised by the New Testament. It is significant that the New Testament features hundreds of Old Testament allusions. Only two are from the body of books known as the Apocrypha (Jude 9, 14) seemingly in similar style to Paul's quotation from a Greek poet (Acts 17:28). The Apocryphal books were perceived to be on a lower level.

#### Next, what determined inclusion in the New Testament Canon?

- 3. Books that are Christ-centred in their emphasis. It was inconceivable to the early Church that the Gospels, for example, which focused so much upon the life and death of Jesus, could have any lower place than that given to the Old Testament Scriptures.
- 4. Books that are apostolic in their teaching. It was to the apostles exclusively that Jesus promised guidance 'into all truth' through the Holy Spirit's inspiration (John 16:13). The result of this was the New Testament (1 Corinthians 2:12,13). Significantly, Peter brackets Paul's writings with what he calls 'the other scriptures' (2 Peter 3:15,16).
- 5. Books that are faith-building in their effect, and thus, to be read in the congregations (John 20:30,31; 1 Thessalonians 5:27; Colossians 4:16; 1 Peter 2:2; Revelation 1:3). When the Christian scriptures take hold of the thinking of masses of people, they have the effect of 'stabilising society, without sterilising it' (historian T. R. Glover).

The books of the Old Testament were becoming largely accepted by AD 70; those of the New Testament by the end of the second century. The drawing of a line around them discouraged forgers and religious peddlers.

So no one really 'put' the books into the Bible; they put themselves in, because of their innate quality. No council by itself could have conferred authority upon the books; this, they possessed already. It is an authority that is inherent, not imposed. If art lovers say of a Renoir painting, 'This is a genuine Renoir', their acclaim in no way invests the painting with authority; it was already authentic. It is the same with the Scriptures; we can only recognise them as such.... and live by them.


Local honey is a great help against hayfever.

They say that grass-fed dairy milk poses less of a threat to the Amazon and other rainforests than many soya products do.



We wish them well as they prepare for their new posts.





#### When St. Andrew's re-opens for

#### "In-Worship" Services from 4th October.

As you are aware "In-Building" worship will resume on Sunday 4th October.

When we return to "In-Building" Worship, everything will be very different to how it was 6 months ago.

We will have 2 morning services at 9:30am and 11:00am.

Social Distancing – We are required to stay at a social distance of 2 meters from each other while at "In-Building" worship.

Seat Allocation – Pews/ Seats will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. The Church has to fill from the front and empty from the back, row by row. Once all available seats are used then no one else is permitted to enter. We are temporarily making our services a ticket only event – meaning that those who wish to come need to book online or phone the Parish Office and reserve a place each week.

Track and Trace — As with Drive-In Church, a list of everyone in attendance needs to be kept for the purposes of Track and Trace.

Hand Sanitizing and Covid-19 checks – Before you enter the Church you will be requested to use Hand Sanitizer.

Face Masks – Face coverings are recommended for all in attendance.

No Books – While you are welcome to bring your own books, no books will be available to borrow. Everything you need will be on the screen.

Shorter Services – In order to keep close contact with other people to a minimum, the Services will be noticeably shorter.

Sacramental Worship – The Administration of the Sacraments will be very different from what we are used to.




A spokesman for the Royal British Legion said: "The Poppy Appeal





Thanks to those who use the bins at the gate and top of the graveyard. Parking continues to be restricted in line with Insurance advice from the Church and Hall insurers.


On Sundays when Church Services take place, the Graveyard is closed from 9:00am-1:30pm. Thank you for adhering to the rules.



#### **Gardening tips for October**



- Cut back old stems from summer flowering perennials, to about 5cm from the ground, but maybe leave a few seed heads here and there.
- Remove summer bedding and clear the space to plant some winter flowering pansies, heathers, and some evergreen shrubs.
- Lift dahlia and begonia tubers and store them in dry sand or compost in a dry frost free environment over winter.



- Give your flowerbeds a thick layer of compost, bark chippings or well rotted manure. You don't need to dig it in as the worms will do that for you.
- Give your greenhouse a thorough clean. Wash windows and benches and scrub pots, tools and accessories. Make sure to remove dead plants. Don't leave room for pests!!
- Plant up your spring bulbs if you haven't already done so, sow some seeds for early flowers next year.
- Get your lawnmower serviced now as hopefully it will be getting a rest until springtime!

The pandemic is leaving a "lasting digital legacy", and changing the UK's internet habits and behaviour "indelibly". So says a recent Ofcom study.

Since March we have broken the four-hour barrier, which means that, on average, we spend more than a quarter of our waking hours each day online. That is up from an average of three hours and 29 minutes this time last year.

Zoom has soared in popularity. Last December it reached 498,00 people in the UK; by April this had soared to 13million in the UK.

TikTok, which lets users share short videos set to pop music, had 5.4 million UK users in January; by April it had 12.9million users.

In February, 35 per cent of UK adults made a video call once a week. By April that had soared to 71 per cent. The largest increase has been among the over-65s, with now 61 per cent of them making weekly video calls.

Older people favour Zoom, in order to 'visit' their relatives and friends; while many teenagers have become addicted to TikTok and endless videos.



#### Sweet Potato and Carrot Soup With Chilli and Coconut



#### **Ingredients:**

3 large sweet potatoes, peeled and chopped

2 Large onions, peeled and chopped

50g butter

2 potatoes, peeled and chopped

1 red chilli, deseeded and chopped

1x 420g tin coconut milk

600ml vegetable stock

Handful fresh coriander leaves (optional)



#### **Method:**

In a heavy saucepan, on a low heat, gently cook the onions in the butter for 8-10 minutes until softened and turn opaque. Keep lid on but stir occasionally.

Add remaining vegetables, the stock and chopped chilli. Season well, cover and simmer gently until the vegetables are tender, about 15 - 20 minutes.

Remove from heat, add coconut milk and fresh coriander, then liquidise until smooth.

Reheat gently and serve with a slice of wheaten bread from one of our previous recipes!

#### **Instant Chocolate Mousse**



#### **Ingredients:**

150g mini marshmallows

50g soft butter

250g dark chocolate

60ml hot water from recently boiled kettle

284ml double cream

1 teaspoon vanilla extract



#### Method:

Put marshmallows, butter, chocolate and water in a heavy based saucepan.

Put saucepan on hob over a gentle heat, melt the contents, stirring occasionally. Remove from the heat.

Meanwhile, whip the cream with vanilla extract until thick, then fold into the cooling mixture until you have a smooth cohesive mixture.

Pour into 6 glasses or ramekins or 8 smaller ones. Add some cream and sprinkle some grated chocolate on top.

Chill the mousse until you want to eat it.
