

The Rector writes....

No one quite knows what Christmas is going to be like this year. However, one thing is for sure, it will be very different, just like everything else this year has been very different. As we navigate through what is described as 'the most wonderful time of the year' we hold tight to memories from the past.

One of my most favourite services in the Church's year is the 11:30pm Service of Holy Communion on Christmas Eve. Of course this year, it will be very different, and please keep an eye on our Social Media Outlets for updates as to what will happen this year. In normal times, at that service I enjoy the

dramatic feeling of entering Church in total darkness, and how that during the reading of the Christmas Gospel, the lights are switched on and the Church illuminates with the brightness of the lights. At this point in the service the figure of the Baby Jesus is placed in our Nativity Scene and Centre Candle on the Advent Wreath is lit with the other four being extinguished. For me, this does two things:

Firstly - there is a real sense of joy that Christmas is now upon us. The celebrations begin and all has been made ready. There is no more rushing about, no more preparing, no more shopping, no more panic and mayhem that this time of the year can bring.

Secondly - Advent is over, the season of darkness has passed and we are now in the Season of Light. This reminds us that the darkness of sin no longer has dominion over us. The Baby of Bethlehem - the Christ Child, entered the world for one purpose, to die for our sins.

In one Church building I have seen the nativity scene placed below the Christmas Tree, thus reminding us that Jesus is the greatest gift that has been given to us. In another I saw the nativity scene placed in front of a Cross, encouraging us to consider the purpose for which Jesus came - to die for the sins of the world. The Gospel of Matthew points us to this. "She will give birth to a Son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins".

As you celebrate Christmas, and get involved in all the festivities that it brings, do you consider what this one day is all about? Is it really just about the Turkey, the Presents, the Cards, the Decorations, etc? For me, No, it is about far more than that. It is a day set aside to allow me to celebrate the wonderful miracle of knowing that my sins are forgiven, and that when Jesus comes again, I can be sure that I will be with Him in Heaven.

Christmas is all about Love. The Love of God towards us, the Love of God in us, and the Love of God working through us, as we reach out to a broken world. As the hymn states:

Love came down at Christmas, love all lovely, Love divine; Love was born at Christmas; star and angels gave the sign. As I have said, this year Christmas is going to very different for all of us. Why not make the point of keeping in touch with each other during this festive season? Perhaps you could phone someone who you know may be on their own this year, or do some other Act of Random Kindness.

Let the Love of Christ be seen in our lives.





Eritrea—more Christians arrested as others released

Release International can confirm a total of 69 Christian prisoners of faith have now been released in Eritrea – while five more have been arrested.

Release partners say that many have been long-term prisoners. One has been behind bars for 16 years. None has ever been sent to trial.



When news of their release broke in Eritrea, many Christians took to the streets to celebrate – prompting another round of arrests. The authorities seized five women who stepped outside to pray and rejoice at the news.

"These were mothers," says Release International's Eritrean partner, Dr Berhane Asmelash. "One is a mother of five. They were cheering from the roadside – and arrested on the spot."

Dr Berhane estimates some 300 Christian prisoners of faith remain in the country – held indefinitely without charge or ever having been sent for trial. Prisoners face hardship, illness and malnutrition. Most of the prisons don't even have toilet facilities.

"Eritrea has been likened to the North Korea of Africa," says Release International CEO Paul Robinson. "It began its crackdown on churches in 2002."

How many Christians are there in Eritrea? (Open Doors)

Christians make up almost half the population in Eritrea – 2.5 million from a population of 5.3 million. Muslims make up approximately the same percentage.

Why are Christians persecuted in Eritrea? (Open Doors)

Christians who aren't members of state-approved churches are considered agents of the West and a threat to the state. That means some denominations are recognised by the government, including the Eritrean Orthodox Church (EOC) — but these are tightly controlled by the government. The EOC sees the growing number of evangelicals as a threat, and Christians face severe consequences if they criticise President Isayas Afewerki or his party.

Mary & Joseph and Covid-19

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world... And everyone went to their own town to register. So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David. (Luke 2 1-4)



Requirements for In-Building Worship Services when Lockdown ends again.

Each week you must book online or phone the Parish Office, Tue - Thurs 10.30am-1pm, and Heather will book you in. This is

essential as unfortunately if you haven't booked in you won't be able to enter the building.

Online Booking opens at 10.30am each Tuesday.

Watch Social Media for current updates and guidelines.

Social Distancing – We are required to stay at a social distance of 2 meters from each other while at "In-Building" worship.

Seat Allocation – Pews/ Seats will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. The Church has to fill from the front and empty from the back, row by row. Once all available seats are used then no one else is permitted to enter. We are temporarily making our services a ticket only event – meaning that those who wish to come need to book online or phone the Parish Office and reserve a place each week.

Track and Trace — As with Drive-In Church, a list of everyone in attendance needs to be kept for the purposes of Track and Trace.

Hand Sanitizing and Covid-19 checks — Before you enter the Church you will be requested to use Hand Sanitizer.

Face Masks – Face coverings are recommended for all in attendance.

No Books – While you are welcome to bring your own books, no books will be available to borrow. Everything you need will be on the screen.

Shorter Services – In order to keep close contact with other people to a minimum, the Services will be noticeably shorter.

Sacramental Worship – The Administration of the Sacraments will be very different from what we are used to.

The teacher asked her Sunday School class to draw a picture of a Bible story with a Christmas theme. She was puzzled by Kate's picture, which showed four people on an airplane. She asked her which story it was meant to represent. 'The Flight to Egypt,' was the reply.

Pointing at each figure, the teacher ventured: 'That must be Mary, Joseph, and Baby Jesus. But who's the fourth person?"'

'Oh,' explained Kate happily, 'that's Pontius - the pilot!'

Hope amidst the chaos

Therefore, the Lord himself will give you a sign: the virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and will call Him Immanuel.' (Isaiah 7:14)

This promise to King Ahaz in 8th century Judah is fulfilled in the coming of Jesus at the first Christmas: 'God with Us' (Matthew 1:23). Ahaz faced the military threat of Syria invading Israel, but Isaiah tells him not to panic. He can trust God, who is in control of the nation.



For us, Covid 19 brings deep uncertainty as we come to another New Year. We live with the threat from the virus, economic uncertainty, separation from family and friends, the loss of loved ones and the anxiety that isolation brings. Yet the message of Immanuel brings hope, for us, as it did for Ahaz! Christmas changes everything forever! God has declared in Christ that He is with us and for us, not absent from or against us. His love is larger than our sin, fears or guilt: 'If God is for us, who can be against us?' (Romans 8:31).

As we prepare for the most unusual Christmas ever, let's not forget:

God with us means that He is on my side and by my side. In the uncertainties of life I am never alone.

God with us means that everything will work out according to His plan. My life isn't just a series of meaningless occasions or mistakes.

God with us means that even when others show they are not there for me, God is.

God with us means when circumstances change, He will give me the strength I need.





LEMON SQUARES

4 ozs. margarine. 4 ozs. coconut. small tin condensed milk.

7 ozs. digestive biscuit crumbs

1 lemon

Melt margarine and condensed milk. Add biscuit crumbs, coconut and grated lemon rind. Press into swiss roll tin. Leave aside. Make icing, using icing sugar and boiled lemon joice. Spread over biscuit mixture.

SNOWBALLS

2 ozs. margarine. 2 ozs. drinking chocolate. 6 ozs. marshmallows. Small tin condensed milk. 4 lb. digestive biscuit. Coconut to decorate.

Melt margarine, add milk, biscuits and drinking chocolate. Mould a little mixture round each mallow. Roll in coconut.

TRUFFLES

2 ozs. margarine. 2 ozs. sugar. 2 ozs. drinking chocolate. 4 tablespoons flakemeal.

2 desertspoons milk. 4 tablespoons coconut.

Melt margarine, sugar and milk in a saucepan and add the other ingredients. Mix well and leave for about two hours. Form into balls and roll in chocolate vermicilli. Place a small piece of cherry and angelica on top for decoration.

COFFEE CAKE

4 ozs. soft margarine. 1 tablespoon milk.

6 ozs. caster sugar. 1 tablespoon coffee essence. 7 ozs. plain flour. 3 large eggs.

Pinch salt. 2 teaspoons B.P.

Place all except B.P. in bowl and beat until light and creamy. Then add B.P. Bake at 7, 375 or 200 degrees.

This recipe can be used for an ordinary sandwich cake by omitting coffee and adding 2 tablespoons of milk. A chocolate cake can be made by dissolving ½ oz. chocolate powder in 2 tablespoons milk and adding ½ oz. less flour. It will also make 2 dozen plain buns.

CHERRY CAKE

4 ozs. butter.
4 ozs. caster sugar.
7 ozs. plain flour.
1½ level teaspoon B.P.
pinch salt.
8 ozs. cherries.

eggs. 1 dessertspoon milk.

Wash cherries in warm water, dry carefully. Line 6" tin with greaseproof paper. Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs. Sift flour, B.P. and salt. Cut cherries in half and stir a tablespoon of flour into them to coat thoroughly. Stir flour lightly into mixture with the milk, then stir in cherries. Do not beat at this stage. Put in tin and bake in centre of oven. 350 degrees for 1 hour, 40 minutes.



BOILED CAKE (Sufficient for 2 Loaf tins)

10 ozs. sugar. 1½ teacups water.

4 ozs. margarine. 2 eggs.

12-14 ozs. flour. 1 heaped teaspoon B. Soda 10-12 ozs. mixed fruit. 1 heaped teaspoon Ground 1 heaped teaspoon Ground Ginger.

Mixed Spice. ½ teaspoon salt.

Simmer margarine, sugar, water and fruit for 5 minutes. Cool slightly. Sieve dry ingredients. Beat eggs and add with dry ingredients to cooled mixture. Mix well. Divide into 2 tins. Bake at 325 degrees for ½ hour, 300 degrees for another ½ hour. Switch off oven and leave for 15 minutes. Cool in tin.


