The Rector writes....



So here we are again, approaching the Easter season. For the second year in a row Holy Week and Easter is going to be very different. I know I wasn't the only one who this time last year thought that everything would be back to normal in a few weeks. Little did we think that one year later we would still be in a worldwide pandemic. However, just because Holy Week and Easter will be different, it doesn't mean it will be any less poignant.

During my Christian life I have always looked on Holy Week as being like a mini pilgrimage. Each Church Service, Devotion, Prayer Time, is another step along the path to Good Friday and ultimately Easter Day – The Day of Resurrection.

Christians often take the words of Psalm 84 as a basis as they embark on pilgrimages to aid them on their journey of drawing closer to God. It is about giving oneself permission to take time away from the 'norms' of everyday life and spend more time with God. For some, a pilgrimage takes the form of going on a retreat, or working their way through a devotional book etc. For others, they choose to embark upon more physical pilgrimages such as walking a set route like the Camino de Glendalough in the Wicklow Mountains, or going further afield and walking the 500 miles of the Camino de Santiago that starts in a small southern French village and concludes in Santiago on the North Western Coast of Spain. This journey is not an easy one, it is physically, emotionally and spiritually demanding. There are mountains to climb, valleys to discover, flat terrains to enjoy. With each step comes its own challenges and is intended to help the pilgrim rely more and more on God. Along the journey there is often opportunities to interact with other pilgrims who help encourage each other to keep taking another step.

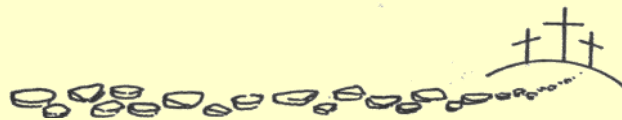
Regardless of what form a pilgrimage takes, the purpose of it is to stop, reflect, seek, find, and embrace what God reveals to us as we journey in and out of our comfort zones. This is a model for life. In fact, let me suggest that life in itself is actually a pilgrimage. We all face Mountains that seem impossible to overcome, Valleys that bring welcome refreshments, and Flat Terrains that provide opportunities for everything to feel 'normal'.

Honesty time for the Rector... Over the past few weeks, on my own personal pilgrimage I feel like I am climbing a very steep mountain out of a very dark valley. At times I have to focus on taking just one step at a time. I find myself clinging to one verse of scripture and one line out of a modern hymn. Psalm 18 verse 2 *"The LORD is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer; my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold."* For me, it is important to continually re-focus on the fact that even when I feel most alone and scared God is with me every step of the way.

I have also found myself praying over and over again the first line of the hymn 'He will hold me fast' written by the Getty's, "When I fear my faith will fail, Christ will hold me fast". I share this with you, not because I am looking sympathy, but because we are all pilgrims on a journey. I want to take this opportunity to say thank you to the pilgrims who have helped and are continuing to help me on my own journey.

The ultimate purpose of a pilgrimage is to bring us to a place where we can fully encounter and experience God in our lives. Jesus said "*I have come that they [you] may have life, and have it to the full*" (John 10:10). One day, our pilgrimage on this earth will come to an end. For those of us who fully trust in Jesus as our "...rock, fortress and deliverer..." we will be given "*life, and have it to the full*" from the One who said "*I am the resurrection and life*" (John 11:25).

So this Holy Week and Easter please take time and embark upon your own pilgrimage and stop, reflect, seek, find, and embrace all that God has done for you.

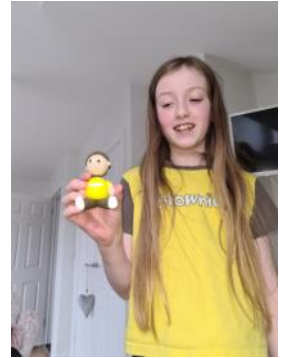

Easter Story Biscuits for young children

Prep. Time: 20 minutes

Total Time: 1 day

Ingredients:

110 grams of pecan nuts

5 grams vinegar

3 egg whites

1 pinch salt

200 grams sugar

large plastic bag

wooden spoon

tape

Bible



Instructions:

Preheat oven to 150C

Place pecans in the plastic bag and let the children beat them with the wooden spoon to break into small pieces. Explain that after Jesus was arrested, He was beaten by the Roman soldiers. Read John 19:1-3.

Let each child smell the vinegar. Put vinegar into mixing bowl. Explain that when Jesus was thirsty on the cross He was given vinegar to drink. Read John 19:28-30.

Add egg whites to vinegar. Eggs represent life. Explain that Jesus gave His life to give us life. Read John 10:10-11.

Sprinkle a little salt into each child's hand. Let them taste it and brush the rest into the bowl. Explain that this represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' followers, and the bitterness of our own sin. Read Luke 23:27.

So far the ingredients are not very appetising...

Add sugar. Explain that the sweetest part of the story is that Jesus died because He loves us. He wants us to know and belong to Him. Read Ps. 34:8 and John 3:16.

Beat with a mixer on high speed until stiff peaks are formed. Explain that the colour white represents the purity in God's eyes of those whose sins have been cleansed by Jesus. Read Isaiah 1:18 and John 3:1-3.

Fold in broken nuts.

Drop by teaspoons onto non-stick baking parchment-covered baking sheet. Explain that each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus' body was laid. Read Matthew 27:57-60.

Put the baking sheet in the oven, close the door and turn the oven OFF. Give each child a piece of tape and seal the oven door. Explain that Jesus' tomb was sealed. Read Matthew 27:65-66.

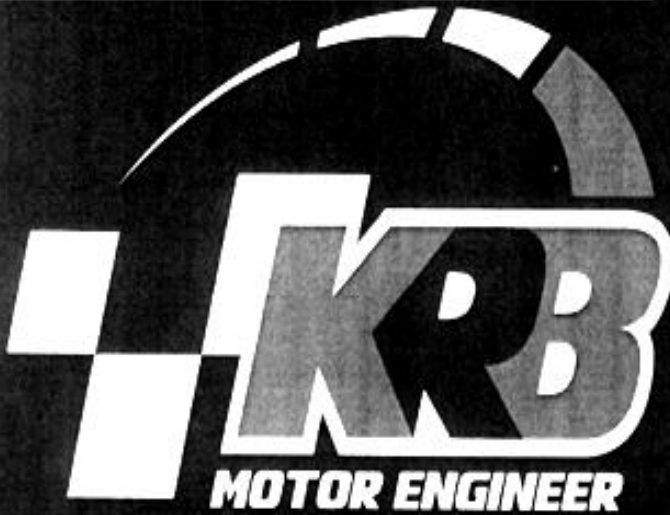

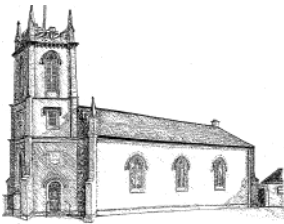

Requirements for In-Building Worship Services

Watch Social Media for current updates and guidelines.

Social Distancing – We are required to stay at a social distance of 2 meters from each other while at “In-Building” worship.

Seat Allocation – Pews/ Seats will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. The Church has to fill from the front and empty from the back, row by row. Once all available seats are used then no one else is permitted to enter. We are temporarily making our services a ticket only event – meaning that those who wish to come need to book online or phone the Parish Office and reserve a place each week.

Track and Trace – As with Drive-In Church, a list of everyone in attendance needs to be kept for the purposes of Track and Trace.

Hand Sanitizing and Covid-19 checks – Before you enter the Church you will be requested to use Hand Sanitizer.

Face Masks – Face coverings are mandatory for all in attendance.

No Books – While you are welcome to bring your own books, no books will be available to borrow. Everything you need will be on the screen.

Shorter Services – In order to keep close contact with other people to a minimum, the Services will be noticeably shorter.

Sacramental Worship – The Administration of the Sacraments will be very different from what we are used to.

Parish Giving

The Gift Aid Scheme and Planned Giving.

The Gift Aid Scheme allows the Church (as a registered charity) to claim an extra 25% on donations made through it. For the Church to claim this, the donor must be a UK income tax payer and must have signed a declaration form.

We are very grateful to all the parishioners who have already signed a declaration. If there is anyone who may be eligible and has not signed a declaration form, please consider doing so. It could mean extra income for the Church without any further expense to you. Please contact the treasurer or Parish Office for details.

Over time people's circumstances change and they may no longer pay income tax. If you signed a declaration form in the past but no longer pay income tax, then the Church must not claim Gift Aid tax relief on your donations. If this applies to you please contact the Parish Office or treasurer, so that the tax relief is not claimed in error.

Over the past year, when Church services have been severely disrupted, a number of Parishioners have signed up to give their donations by standing order, through their bank and the Church is very grateful to them.

These regular donations allow the Select Vestry to, more easily, plan for future expenditure. If you wish to set up such a standing order, please contact the Parish Office or the treasurer.

Newborn Knit Baby Hats

Supplies:

Size 6 Needles – American (equals size 8 UK needles)

Medium Weight (4) Yarn (I like to use a soft yarn like Red Heart Soft)

Gauge: 4.5 stitches per inch (or 2 stitches per centimeter)

Cast on 48 stitches

Work in Knit 1, Purl 1 ribbing for 1" (about 6 rows)

Knit in Stockinette Stitch (knit 1 row, purl 1 row) for 3" inches. End with a purl row. Piece will now measure 4" from the beginning.

Begin Decrease for top of hat:

Next Row: Knit 2 together across row (24 stitches)

Next Row: Purl across

Next Row: Knit 2 together across row (12 stitches)

Next Row: Purl across

Next Row: Knit 2 together across row (6 stitches)

Cut yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing up seam. Thread the tail of yarn through a large eye needle and then pull through the stitches to remove them from the needle. Pull stitches tight to gather. Sew seam down side of hat with remaining yarn. Make pom pom and fasten to top of hat.

Ideas for striped Hats: { MC = Main Color CC = Contrasting Color }

Wide Stripe Pattern:

Do Ribbing in MC

Then in stockinette stitch:

4 rows: MC

4 rows: CC

4 rows: MC

4 rows: CC (break off CC)

2 rows: MC

Continuing with MC, begin decrease rows and complete the hat.



Skinny Stripe Pattern:

Do Ribbing in MC

Then in stockinette stitch:

2 rows: MC

2 rows: CC

2 rows: MC

2 rows: CC

2 rows: MC

2 rows: CC

2 rows: MC

2 rows: CC (break off CC)

2 rows: MC

Continuing with MC, begin decrease rows and complete the hat



2 Stripe Pattern

Do Ribbing in MC

Then in stockinette stitch:

4 rows: MC

2 rows: CC

4 rows: MC

2 rows: CC (break off CC)

6 rows MC

Continuing in MC, begin decrease rows and complete the hat.
