#### The Rector writes....

Summer... here already? Doesn't time seem to go by so fast? It seems like no time since the end of March when the last magazine was being put together. Where have those two months gone?

As many will have heard me say at some stage in Church, one thing which I enjoy about the summer is walking along the beach, particularly in the summer evenings (when we


have decent weather). I love to listen to and watch the waves as they wash up on the beach and disturb the resting sand - each wave leaving behind its own unique track on the beach. As I watch and listen, I think about how every wave is commanded by God, each grain of sand is made by God, and if this beautiful part of creation were not part of His plan, then those waves would not roll and the grains of sand would not be there. It would be impossible to count how many grains of sand are in one handful, never mind on one beach, but yet the Psalmist reminds us *"How precious to me are your thoughts, God! How vast is the sum of them! Were I to count them, they would outnumber the grains of sand—when I awake, I am still with you" (Psalm 139 17+18).* This bodes a question - how precious are the thoughts of God to each of us? Do we take time to stop and think about what God is really saying to us and doing in our lives?

Earlier in this Psalm in verse 4 we read "Before a word is on my tongue you, Lord, know it completely" and in verse 13 "For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb". God knows everything there is to know about us, He even knows things about us that we don't know ourselves. So, it is only right that we seek to follow God with every part of our being, because in verse 1 the Psalmist writes "You have searched me, Lord, and you know me", and after all "Even the winds and the waves obey him!" (Matthew 8:27). How great thou art!

> O Lord my God! When I in awesome wonder consider all the works thy hand hath made I see the stars, I hear the mighty thunder, thy power throughout the universe displayed: Then sings my soul, my Saviour God to thee, How great thou art, how great thou art!

Heavenly Father, pour out your Spirit upon the people of our parish and upon those who are in positions of leadership and ministry. Forgive us our many sins and draw us nearer to you. # Queen Elizabeth II Defender of the Faith

& Supreme Governor of the Church of England



There can be no doubt that our Queen has taken her formal role as Defender of the Faith very seriously throughout her long reign. This is the role she acquired with the Monarchy but her strong faith in God has been evident throughout her life even before she was crowned Queen.

In her first Christmas broadcast to the nation in 1952, before her coronation she made this prayer request:

'Pray for me ... that God may give me wisdom and strength to carry out the solemn promises I shall be making, and that I may faithfully serve Him and you, all the days of my life.'


Her Christmas broadcasts to the Commonwealth are among the few speeches she writes herself. They frequently refer to Jesus Christ, the founder of Christianity, whose birth is celebrated at Christmas. Alongside her official role as head of the Church of England, the Queen expresses a personal faith in Jesus Christ.

As she said in her Christmas broadcast in December 2000: 'For me the teachings of Christ and my own personal accountability before God provide a framework in which I try to lead my life.'

In her 2020 broadcast on Christmas Eve from Windsor Castle, where she had been isolating with Prince Philip due to the Covid-19 pandemic, she said: 'We continue to be inspired by the kindness of strangers and draw comfort that - even on the darkest nights - there is hope in the new dawn. Jesus touched on this with the parable of the Good Samaritan. The man who is robbed and left at the roadside is saved by someone who did not share his religion or culture. This wonderful story of kindness is still as relevant today. Good Samaritans have emerged across society showing care and respect for all, regardless of gender, race or background, reminding us that each one of us is special and equal in the eyes of God.'

May we take time to pray for our Queen as she requested so long ago, may we each come to know Jesus as our Lord and Saviour and follow her example to live a Godly life and be accountable before God.

### Happy 95th birthday Queen Elizabeth, 10th June 2021.



"We have thanked God for Prince Philip's life of extraordinary service. There are some rare people who bring energy into a room – the Duke of Edinburgh was very much one of those people. His presence lifted a gathering. He might have challenged and interrogated, but whatever he said, he never bored anyone.

"The Duke of Edinburgh had a profound moral imagination, extraordinary foresight and even vision. He saw the world not just as it is but as it could and should be, as worked out in his commitment to young people, especially through the Duke of Edinburgh's Award, to the Commonwealth, to our Armed Forces, and to engineering, technology and design... In Edmund Burke's words, he had an instinctive sense that the social contract was found in the traditions we inherit from the past, in our obligations to the present and in our responsibility to those yet to be born.

"His genuine and deep sense of humility and his service came from the same place, which was his faith... He had a sincere Christian faith absolutely untainted by false piety... He understood deeply how important faith is for the vast majority of the world's population. He engaged the rich diversity of faiths within the UK and the Commonwealth. He was a pioneer in recognising the crucial role that faith leaders play in advocating for creation care. He was literally half a century ahead of his time in this area.

Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, was born 100 years ago on 10<sup>th</sup> June 1921, on a dining room table in Corfu, at a villa called Mon Repos.

He was born Prince Philip of Greece and Denmark and always thought of himself as Danish, though he was in line of succession to both thrones. He was the fifth child of Princess Alice of Battenberg and Prince Andrew of Greece and Denmark. He left Greece at the age of 18 months, travelling in an orange crate crib, when his father was banished from the country as a result of the Greeco-Turkish war.


Philip was brought up as a Greek Orthodox Christian but spoke neither Greek nor Danish, though he was fluent in French and German. He lived part of his childhood years in Paris. His maternal grandfather, Prince Louis of Battenberg, who died shortly after Philip's birth, was a naturalised British subject who changed his name to Mountbatten – a "translation" of Battenberg – because of anti-German sentiment following the war. This was the name Philip eventually took.

Philip's mother was diagnosed with schizophrenia and spent little time with her son, being confined to an asylum. Before his attachment to Princess Elizabeth, Philip was linked with Canadian debutante Osla Benning.



A Pastoral Letter from the Archbishop of Armagh Brothers and sisters in Christ,

As a Church family we have come through a great deal since St Patrick's Day 2020 when the first lockdown came into effect. Many restrictions, a number of subsequent lockdowns and all the weariness these have brought. For centuries parish churches have stayed together by worshipping together, so not being able to do that (at least as we would have wished) had the potential to cause a great deal of long term damage to parish life.

I know that as individuals many people have suffered much, with demoralising periods of isolation, lack of contact with those who we love and even desolating bereavements. But as a Church we have come through this dark period a good deal better than most people anticipated. I was able to thank the clergy for the part they played in that effort in a Zoom meeting last week.

Unfortunately it's not possible to accommodate the whole Diocese on a Zoom call, so I have written this short Pastoral Letter to be read out on 16 May, the Sunday after The Ascension Day. I simply want to say a very heartfelt "thank you" to every parishioner in the Diocese. Thank you for your faithfulness to God and His Church and for living out your vocation as disciples of Jesus Christ during a very uncertain time. Thank you for finding ways of sustaining the Church by online participation, by community involvement, and by giving of your substance as you have always done. These have been testing times for parishes and you have not allowed the test to wholly overwhelm you. Perhaps it's a little bit of an exaggerated parallel but I think we can look to St Paul's words in 2 Corinthians for inspiration "...we are hard pressed on all sides but not crushed; perplexed but not in despair....struck down but not destroyed..."

We can say this only because you have been faithful, and have done what you could to maintain the life of your parishes. When we could not meet I have no doubt you prayed and persevered. When we returned to worship, those of you who were able, came back with joy. As far as I can tell you have served God and your parishes cheerfully. And God loves a cheerful giver.

That is not to say that everything will soon return to the way it always has been; or even as it was on St Patrick's Day 2020. There could yet be setbacks. And as a very wise Irishman once said "Things must change in order to remain the same". We cannot say with 100% confidence that Covid-19 has been defeated; but it has not beaten us in our believing lives. The terrible scenes in other countries, and especially in India, are truly heart rending and I know that we will all be doing what we can to relieve that suffering.

But for now, for us, thank you for all you have done and I trust will continue to do to "build back better" in the parishes which lie so close to your hearts, and for the God who you love and serve. It is my sincere prayer that you can have a refreshing summer, enjoying the beauties of our own countryside and seaside and that you can join with me in saying "Thanks be to God"

### Requirements for In-Building Worship Services

Watch Social Media for current updates and guidelines.

Social Distancing – We are required to stay at a social distance of 2 meters from each other while at "In-Building" worship.

Seat Allocation – Pews/ Seats will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. The Church has to fill from the front and empty from the back, row by row. Once all available seats are used then no one else is permitted to enter. We are temporarily making our services a ticket only event – meaning that those who wish to come need to book online or phone the Parish Office and reserve a place each week.

Track and Trace – As with Drive-In Church, a list of everyone in attendance needs to be kept for the purposes of Track and Trace.

Hand Sanitizing and Covid-19 checks – Before you enter the Church you will be requested to use Hand Sanitizer.

Face Masks – Face coverings are mandatory for all in attendance.

No Books – While you are welcome to bring your own books, no books will be available to borrow. Everything you need will be on the screen.

Shorter Services – In order to keep close contact with other people to a minimum, the Services will be noticeably shorter.

Sacramental Worship – The Administration of the Sacraments will be very different from what we are used to.



### Newborn Knit Baby Hats

Pattern courtesy of TheMakeYourOwnZone.com



Supplies:

Size 6 Needles – American (equals size 8 UK needles)

Medium Weight (4) Yarn (I like to use a soft yarn like Red Heart Soft)

Gauge: 4.5 stitches per inch (or 2 stitches per centimeter)

Cast on 48 stitches

Work in Knit 1, Purl 1 ribbing for 1" (about 6 rows) Knit in Stockinette Stitch (knit 1 row, purl 1 row) for 3" inches. End with a purl row. Piece will now measure 4" from the beginning.

Begin Decrease for top of hat: Next Row: Knit 2 together across row (24 stitches) Next Row: Purl across Next Row: Knit 2 together across row (12 stitches) Next Row: Purl across Next Row: Knit 2 together across row (6 stitches)

Cut yarn, leaving a long tail for sewing up seam. Thread the tail of yarn through a large eye needle and then pull through the stitches to remove them from the needle. Pull stitches tight to gather. Sew seam down side of hat with remaining yarn. Make pom pom and fasten to top of hat.

# **Parish Giving**

### The Gift Aid Scheme and Planned Giving.

The Gift Aid Scheme allows the Church (as a registered charity) to claim an extra 25% on donations made through it. For the Church to claim this, the donor must be a UK income tax payer and must have signed a declaration form.

We are very grateful to all the parishioners who have already signed a declaration. If there is anyone who may be eligible and has not signed a declaration form, please consider doing so. It could mean extra income for the Church without any further expense to you. Please contact the treasurer or Parish Office for details.

Over time people's circumstances change and they may no longer pay income tax. If you signed a declaration form in the past but no longer pay income tax, then the Church must not claim Gift Aid tax relief on your donations. If this applies to you please contact the Parish Office or treasurer, so that the tax relief is not claimed in error.

Over the past year, when Church services have been severely disrupted, a number of Parishioners have signed up to give their donations by standing order, through their bank and the Church is very grateful to them.
