The Rector writes....

This will be my last letter to you in the Parish Magazine as your Rector. You will have heard by now that on Sunday 29th August I announced to the Parish that at a Board of Nomination in the Diocese of Down and Dromore, I was nominated and appointed to serve as Rector of the Parish of Donaghcloney. After a lot of time thinking and praying I accepted the call to move. I just wanted in a few lines to take this opportunity and explain how this call came about.

The first thing I want to say is that I did not apply for this position. The nominators of Donaghcloney contacted me at the beginning of June and asked if I would consider this position. After a couple of days of thinking about it, I contacted the nominators and thanked them very much for having me on their

list, but declined the offer to explore the position further.

While I was on holidays in July, I received a telephone call from one of the Donaghcloney Nominators. She said they were disappointed when I withdrew my name from the process and asked would I re-consider my decision and meet with them. When I returned from holidays, the process began. The nominators had watched several of the services that are on our Youtube page and came to one in-building service in Killyman. They met with me twice and I met with the Bishop once. During this time, I had a list of reasons for saying no to the process, and one by one the Lord took all the reasons away. So after a lot of prayer, thinking and chatting it through with my nearest and dearest, I accepted the call to be Rector of Donaghcloney.

Sunday 19th September was Vocations Sunday in the Church of Ireland where we are all encouraged to consider the call of God in our own lives. The call of God comes in different ways to different people. Not everyone is called to the Ordained Ministry, but God does call us all. To be called means to receive an invitation. Once the invitation has been extended it is up to the recipient as to whether to accept the invite or not.

The first and most important call which comes our way is to be called a child of God — "Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God—children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God." (John 1:12+13). God calls (invites) each of us into a relationship with Him. He longs for us to be His children. John clearly states in the first few words of verse 12 "Yet to all who did receive him", meaning those who have accepted the invitation to accept Jesus as their own personal Saviour. This bodes a couple of questions for you to ponder — are you counted amongst the "to all who did"? and are you a Child of God?

In the next few weeks the Parish is going to once again go into a Vacancy. There will be many roles within Parish life that will need looked after and will need volunteers to do so, and no doubt the Rural Dean, Rev. Canon Peter Thompson will guide you through. Please support the Rural Dean and the Office Holders of the Parish as they lead the Parish through this time of change.

In preparation for and during the vacancy I would like to issue a call and invite you to respond and pray. Please pray for:

The Rural Dean as he takes responsibility for the Parish during the vacancy

The Parochial Nominators as they await the Archbishop's call to begin the process of searching for a suitable candidate to Call to be Rector

The Churchwardens and Glebewardens as they take on extra responsibilities during the vacancy

The Select Vestry in decisions they will have to make regarding Fabrics, Furnishings and Finance

The Clergy and Diocesan Readers who will lead and preach at Public Worship

Finally I would ask that you would find it in your hearts to pray for me as well as I respond to the Call God has placed on my life and prepare to change my home, congregation and community.

Please know that you are all in my prayers and I will watch with interest how the Parish of Killyman progresses in the future. As I finish this letter I want to pray over you and your family the words of Numbers 6:24-26

> "Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine on you and be gracious to you; the Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace."

A Prayer for the Parish

Heavenly Father, pour out your Spirit upon the people of our parish and upon those who are in positions of leadership and ministry. Forgive us our many sins and draw us nearer to you. Grant us a new awareness of your Presence, a new experience of your Power, a new understanding of your Word, and a new commitment to your Service. Open our eyes to the opportunities you give us, open our ears to hear your call, open our hearts to your love that we may serve you. Grant us faith to believe, and strength to do your will now and always. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.





So John was killed* and Salome was given his head. She gave it to her mother.








Please note:

The Covid-19 Vaccination Clinic will be using the hall to distribute 2nd doses of the vaccine on 20th October from 8.30am. 380 people availed of the service for their first dose, coming from all over N.I.

Requirements for In-Building Worship Services

Watch Social Media for current updates and guidelines.



Social Distancing – We are still required to stay at a social distance of 1 metre from each other while at "In-Building" worship.

Seat Allocation – Pews/ Seats will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. The Church has to fill from the front and empty from the back, row by row. Once all available seats are used then no one else is permitted to enter. We are temporarily making our services a ticket only event – meaning that those who wish to come need to book online or phone the Parish Office and reserve a place each week.

Track and Trace – a list of everyone in attendance needs to be kept for the purposes of Track and Trace. For 21 days. This is in line with GDPR.

Hand Sanitizing and Covid-19 checks – Before you enter the Church you will be requested to use Hand Sanitizer.

Face Masks – Face coverings must be worn upon entering and exiting the building. It is recommended to wear them during services

No Books – While you are welcome to bring your own books, no books will be available to borrow. Everything you need will be on the screen.

Shorter Services – In order to keep close contact with other people to a minimum, the Services will be noticeably shorter.

Sacramental Worship – The Administration of the Sacraments will be very different from what we are used to.



"I am fearfully and wonderfully made"!

Every person was once a sperm and an egg. Those two unique germ cells fused together, and in nine months they turned into a living, breathing, human being. One of the most important stages of this process is when each section of the body, from head to rump, takes on its identity.

In this context, identity means what shape it takes, and which limbs or internal organs grow there: legs or arms, lungs or pancreas, and so on. The source of that physical identity is DNA: the networks of genes that are switched on or Danny Allison, © Lion Hudson IP Limite off in each segment of the body, making all the



proteins that are needed to grow and develop in the right way. The master-genes that control the whole process are called homeobox, or Hox genes for short.


The most beautiful thing about the process of body patterning is the way it brings the dimensions of time and space together in such a tidy way. The Hox genes are organised into several clusters on the chromosomes, in the order in which they are needed during development *and* the order in which they appear on the body.

As the embryo develops, the cells near the head end activate the first genes in the Hox clusters. The cells just below the head then switch on the second genes in the cluster, and so on. A wave of gene activation passes down the embryo, specifying each section of the trunk in turn.

Once a Hox gene is switched on it can stay switched on in the next few sections of cells, and it is the overlapping activity of the genes which gives each section of the body its proper identity.

The Wisconsin-based developmental biologist Jeff Hardin often quotes Psalm 139 to express the wonder of embryonic development. "For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb...your works are wonderful, I know that full well. My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth." The story of the tidy Hox genes is very relevant to these verses, bringing out the hidden beauty in the process.

The more biologists get to find out about how we came to be born, the more we can say, "I am fearfully and wonderfully made"!



ATTENTION ALL HALL USERS –

Important Information

At a recent meeting of the Select Vestry the latest guidelines from the Church of Ireland were considered and the Select Vestry agreed the following protocols for the re-opening of the Parish Hall to Parish Based Groups.

- All hall bookings <u>must be</u> made via the Parish Office and booked for no more than one month in advance.
- Groups/users must complete and submit a full risk assessment for their organisation/ meeting to the Parish Office no later than 24 hours before each meeting. A template of a Risk Assessment is available from the Parish Office upon request.
- On each Risk Assessment, each group must identify the person who is responsible for ensuring that the room being used is fully sanitized when the group has finished using the hall. Training will be provided for those named.
- No more than two groups will be permitted to use each room in any one day.

 This is to allow time for the sanitizing products to work properly. Groups who normally meet weekly, may have to consider bi-weekly meetings or change of day for the time being.
- Catering/ In-House prepared refreshments are not yet permitted at any meetings.
- On entering and exiting any building everyone should sanitize their hands.
- The Foyer should not be used for dropping off, waiting for or collecting hall users. Where possible, the entry and exit points should be the nearest external door. (E.g. Bush Hall users enter and exit via the Fire Exit. Killyman Hall users enter and exit via the external door beside the kitchen.)
- Any user displaying symptoms should not attend meetings.
- Face masks must be worn at all activities taking place in the Parish Hall, except for seated business meetings which are not accessible to the general public (e.g. Select Vestry Meetings). However, it is recommended that masks be worn at all times regardless of the activity.
- Social distancing continues to be adhered too.
- Windows (or external doors where the windows can't be opened) in the room being used must be opened to allow for ventilation.

While it is a positive step in being able to re-open to Parish Groups, we would ask all users to please be patient and adhere to all the guidelines as we do our best to keep everyone as safe as possible. Thank you for your co-operation.




Look out for the Poppy Appeal again this year, but not so much via street collections. Instead, the Royal British Legion will focus on contactless donations, as a safer way forward during the pandemic.



HOW Should we read our Bible?

There are three things to bear in mind when you pick up your Bible:

First, approach it expectantly. The Bible is not just another book — it is the Word of God, given to us by God to help us and instruct us. The Psalmist declared, 'Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path' (Psalm 119:105). Therefore, as you open your Bible, pray that the Holy Spirit (who inspired the writers of the Bible) will illumine its meaning to you. Read it carefully, not just hurrying through it as you would a novel.

Secondly, read your Bible systematically. Aim to read about three chapters a day: begin at Genesis and work through the Old Testament. Begin in Matthew and work through the New Testament; begin in Psalms and work through Psalms and Proverbs. Simply continue these three cycles, and it will ensure that your diet of Bible reading each day will be varied and include a bit of everything!

Finally, read your Bible obediently. Be ready to obey the truth that God has for you in its pages. God gave the Bible to us 'for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness' (2 Timothy 3:16), and the Bible can change our lives as we read it and obey its teachings every day

Seventy years ago, on 31st October 1951, zebra crossings were introduced officially in the UK. The first one was in Slough, Berkshire.

The crossings had been trialled over two years at 1000 experimental sites, but in 1951 the black and white striped pedestrian crossings were approved, with their flashing Belisha beacons, and all drivers were required by law to stop as

soon as a pedestrian set foot on them.

The crossings were the brainchild of Yorkshireman and traffic engineer George 'Dr Zebra' Charlesworth, a physicist who had worked on the Barnes Wallis-designed bouncing bomb during the war. His zebra crossings were certainly responsible for saving many lives.

The Belisha beacons, an integral part of the crossing but used since 1934, were introduced by Leslie Hore-Belisha, who served as Minister of Transport at the time.

Zebra crossings were adopted throughout the world, from continental Europe to North America, Singapore and Australia. They have now been superseded to some extent in the UK by pelican crossings, which are controlled by lights. These were introduced in 1969. While zebras were named because of their appearance, a pelican crossing (originally pelicon) is so named as a contraction of the phrase 'pedestrian light controlled'.

I'd get my new suit wet.


Today the sky is blue and clear, but the car's as black as ink




