

The Rector writes....

As I write this letter I am looking out the study window in the Rectory and see the vast array of colours that this time of the year gives us. Blue sky can be seen through the clouds, the trees are in full leaf and the flowers are in bloom. The fields have a variety of shades of green where some are mown, some are grazed and some are left untouched. As you know, my Parents' love of music played a massive role in my upbringing, and as I gaze out the window I can't help but

think about the old country song written by Johnny Cash – "40 shades of Green."

In the first line of this song Cash writes, "I close my eyes and picture..." and throughout the song he reminisces, from a mind's eye view, the sights he encountered in 1959 while he visited this island. It is obvious from the words penned that his heart longs to once again visit and see the sights he so clearly remembers. As you reminisce about places that you once visited, does the same sense of longing fill your heart? When you look at photographs, what memories come into your mind, and did those photographs accurately capture, and do justice to, the sights you saw? With the restrictions placed upon us since March 2020, we might wonder will we ever see them again, but we look forward with anticipation that someday we will indeed gaze on those much loved sights.

As Christians, this same sense of longing and anticipation should continually be in our hearts and minds. We look forward to the day when we will see and behold sights which words and pictures could never do justice. As a song by Jim Reeves reminds us, "This world is not my home, I'm just passing through, my treasures are laid up, somewhere beyond the blue. The Angels beckon me, from Heaven's open door, and I can't feel at home, in this world anymore." As believers in Jesus we realise that our home on this earth is only temporary lodgings. However, we have a home waiting for us in Heaven that will last forever. The Apostle Paul writes "But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Saviour from there, the Lord Jesus Christ..." (Philippians 3:20). Our hearts and mind should naturally long for the day when Jesus will come and bring us to our eternal home.

So, this leaves us with a question... When Jesus calls your name,

and when Jesus calls my name, will we occupy the mansion that He has prepared for us to dwell in? As you ponder this question, let me leave you with the words of one more Gospel song:

"What a day that will be
When my Jesus I shall see
And I look upon his face
The one who saved me by his grace
When he takes me by the hand
And leads me through the Promised Land
What a day, glorious day that will be."

The decision about Baptism is a very important one to make and should not be taken lightly. Whether it is for yourself or for your child (and yes the Church of Ireland does Baptise Adults) there are some things which you should think about. At the outset it is important to note that Baptism is not the same thing as Christening, and Christening is not the same thing as Baptism. A Christening is solely a naming ceremony, whereas Baptism is welcoming the candidate into the fellowship of the Church.

As the Church's Catechism teaches Baptism is one of the two Sacraments, which Jesus instructed the disciples to do – the other, being Holy Communion. A Sacrament is the outward sign of the inward experience. In Baptism we use water (whether it is poured on the candidate's head or the Candidate is immersed in water) to signify the washing away of our sins. The important thing to note is that this is a symbol of God's Grace. Baptism in itself does not save us or wash away our sins. It does not make us a Christian, but what it does do is allow us to publically profess our faith and state our intention to follow Jesus for the rest of our life.

This might lead to a further question... Why do we Baptise babies when they are not able to make such a profession? The Church teaches that it is appropriate for Christian Parents to bring their child for Baptism. The Parents publicly declare that they are followers of Jesus and are committed to teaching their children the Christian faith by their own example, by bringing them to Church, in the hope that the child will also come to know and love Jesus and publically profess the faith when they are older.

At the Baptism Service of children the Parents and Godparents are asked some very serious questions. It is important to note that the answers given, though made in the Church, are actually commitments being made to God. Therefore the Parents and Godparents are entering into a covenant with God, which should not be taken lightly, and never be broken. The questions are:

Parents and godparents, will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing ... for baptism and answer on *their* behalf. By your own prayers and example, by your teaching and love, will you encourage *them* in the life and faith of the Christian community?

With the help of God, we will.

In baptism *these* children begin their journey in faith. You speak for *them* today.
Will you care for them,
and help *them* to take their place
within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

With the help of God, we will.

In simple terms, the Parents and Godparents are promising to teach their children about Jesus. They promise to show the Child, by their own example, what it means to be Christian. Also, they promise to bring the Child regularly to Church (not just send them to Sunday School).

After these two questions the Parents and Godparents (or Candidate if an adult) are asked some further questions. The answers to these questions are a public declaration of Faith and the person answering is saying they are a fully committed Christian. The questions are:

Do you reject the devil and all proud rebellion against God?

I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

I renounce them.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the Way, the Truth and the Life?

I come to Christ.

These are good questions to be asked and all of us should think through how we can honestly answer them. These questions and answers describe to us the basics of our faith and what it means to be a Christian.

Unfortunately, in some cases the meaning of Baptism seems to have got lost amongst tradition, celebration and even superstition. However, as we think through the real reason for Baptism we realise it is a very serious moment in the life of the candidate. It should be a life changing decision for all who are presented for, or desire Baptism.

If you are considering Baptism for yourself, or your child, then come along regularly to Church, and then have a chat with the Rector.

Requirements for In-Building Worship Services

Watch Social Media for current updates and guidelines.



In line with recent correspondence from the Archbishop the following restrictions are still in place:

Social Distancing – We are still required to stay at a social distance of 2 meters from each other while at "In-Building" worship.

Seat Allocation – Pews/ Seats will be allocated on a first come, first served basis. The Church has to fill from the front and empty from the back, row by row. Once all available seats are used then no one else is permitted to enter. We are temporarily making our services a ticket only event – meaning that those who wish to come need to book online or phone the Parish Office and reserve a place each week.

Track and Trace – As with Drive-In Church, a list of everyone in attendance needs to be kept for the purposes of Track and Trace.

Hand Sanitizing and Covid-19 checks – Before you enter the Church you will be requested to use Hand Sanitizer.

Face Masks – Face coverings are mandatory for all in attendance.

No Books – While you are welcome to bring your own books, no books will be available to borrow. Everything you need will be on the screen.

Shorter Services – In order to keep close contact with other people to a minimum, the Services will be noticeably shorter.

Sacramental Worship – The Administration of the Sacraments will be very different from what we

are used to.
