

The flowers are blooming, the time of birdsong has come! Song of Songs 2:12



It must have been a dramatic sight on Palm Sunday when Jesus approached Jerusalem to the adulation of the crowds. 'A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of Him and those that followed shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" (Matthew 21:8,9).

But not everyone in Jerusalem welcomed Jesus; in the very next verse we read, 'the whole city was stirred and asked, "Who is this?"'(10). But by the end of the week, the crowds had turned against Jesus and were demanding His crucifixion. (Matthew 27:22).

Why did they turn against Jesus so quickly? Perhaps they were disappointed because He refused to fulfil their expectations in establishing a new political kingdom. Instead, He came to change our hearts and save us from our sins by His death and resurrection. As He said during that week, 'My kingdom is not of this world.' (John 18:36). This deeply disappointed those who hoped that He would throw out the hated Roman occupiers.

Where would we have been on that first Palm Sunday? Among the disciples who welcomed Him or among the sceptical crowds? It's easy to judge those who condemned Jesus, but would we have acted differently? Can we too be disappointed when Jesus fails to meet our hopes and expectations of Him?

The message of Easter is that God still loves and accepts us, and because of Jesus we can be forgiven. He came for one simple reason: 'For Christ also suffered once for sins...to bring you to God.' (1 Peter 3:18). May we welcome Jesus afresh into our lives this Eastertime.


Shrove Tuesday

Some delicious looking pancakes were to be enjoyed around the Parish on Shrove Tuesday, before the start of Lent the next day.















Yes, Britain is in serious political and moral turmoil. So is the USA. Many other countries are heading towards totalitarian rule or are savagely divided along tribal, religious, or racial lines.

We shouldn't concentrate on cataloguing our complaints, though, before counting our blessings, which is a healthier activity for the human soul.

Here's a start. The British National Health Service may not be the best in the world,



but we're the envy of the many countries which have nothing. Arguably, we were the first with a mass vaccination programme. We have a comparatively good legal system which benefits from its independence from Parliament. The introduction of a Living Wage for workers was a step in the right direction.


There are still vestiges of Christian civilisation: we can appeal to an underlying sense of justice, and in this year when we mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, we can be grateful for her exemplary life of Christian service.


Now for the downside. Many of the old moral signposts have been vandalised or destroyed. We don't trust our leaders. So many commercial companies have broken the law (Argos, BP, HSBC, NatWest, Royal Mail, Southeastern Trains, Tesco, Vodafone, Volkswagen, Wells Fargo, etc) that we wonder which others aren't on the list simply because they haven't yet been caught. Fines for breaches in data protection cost (in Euros) Amazon 746m, WhatsApp 225m, Google 50m, British Airways 22m.

Freedom of speech is threatened by those who claim to be liberal minded but would censor anyone who holds different convictions. Sex is now widely regarded as a recreational activity. Most people protest they are not racist, without recognising its insidious subtleties. Hypocrisy is No 1 on the moral hit list, though its origin in the New Testament and, consequently, its true meaning, go unrecognised. We are clinging on to our trust in the Police Force, despite grave breaches by officers.

The 18th Century American President Thomas Jefferson said, "The government you elect is the government you deserve." Jesus said, "Do not judge, so that you may not be judged." Both suggest that criticism should begin at home.


















Killyman Good Companions

After a long break due to Covid-19, Killyman Good Companions were delighted to be back in the Parish Hall on Thursday 17th February 2022. We welcomed Rev William Newell the local Methodist Minister as speaker. Rev Newell who is a keen photographer, showed lovely pictures of his recent visit to the Peak District where he had stayed in the beautiful, historic village of Eyam. Rev Newell related the story of how in 1665, the Plague was spread to the village in a bundle of cloth delivered to the local tailor and how the villagers led by their Vicar, isolated themselves to prevent spread of the disease to other villages. There were many similarities to our own more recent situation with outdoor worship and families not mixing with their neighbours.

Rev Newell then showed a video he had put together from his photographs with musical accompaniment, taking us around the coast from Ballycastle to Londonderry. Rev Newell is also a talented writer and many members were pleased to purchase his book "Fulton's Legacy".

On 3rd March the Good Companions welcomed the Rural Dean, Rev Canon Dr Peter Thompson to our meeting for a morning of Chat and Music. Interviewed by Joan Reid, Canon Peter told his life story from childhood to the present including how he came to be Rector of Castlecaulfield and Donaghmore and how he became assistant organist at St Patrick's Cathedral, Armagh.

This was followed with community singing of some of our favourite and well known hymns including "Great is Thy Faithfulness", "Love Divine", "Take my Life", "Will Your Anchor Hold" and "And Can It Be" with explanations of the composers of the music and the writers of the hymns. We were also treated to a solo of the hymn "He Will Hold Me Fast" an old hymn made popular by the Gettys.

Alan Abraham from Annaginny Fisheries was our speaker on 24th March. Alan, who is Chairman of the Mid Ulster Beekeepers Association gave a very interesting talk on the history of beekeeping. He also demonstrated the tools and garments used by beekeepers when working with their bees and beehives and how the honey is taken off and extracted into jars for the modern market. Colour and flavour of honey depends on the flowers the bees have access to. The Black Irish Bee is the most suitable for our climate as it will work from morning to night even in rainy weather. There was an opportunity to purchase some of the Annaginny Honey which is normally only available at the Annaginny Fisheries.

Further meetings are planned for 7th April and 5th May at 10:30am in the Parish Hall. A warm welcome awaits anyone who has time to spare on those mornings. Meetings usually end at 12 noon. The season will end with an outing to Fermanagh on 26th May beginning with a visit to St McCartan's Cathedral which is celebrating a 400th anniversary and is where Rev Chris West is now serving as Curate.

Christian Basics

'How can a God of love allow suffering?' Many people struggle with such questions, however the Bible helps us to understand how sin affects both our own lives and the world.

Genesis provides us with a picture of how sin entered the world. In Genesis 2:16-17, God gave Adam and Eve both permission ('You are free to eat from any tree in the garden') and a prohibition ('But you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil'), alongside warning them of the consequences of disobedience ('For when you eat of it you will surely die').



In Genesis 3, they broke God's law by eating fruit from the forbidden tree. As a result, their eyes were opened to the nature of sin (they knew *shame*) and their relationship with God was broken (they *hid* from Him). As a consequence, death entered their lives. This story reminds us that God gives us free will (an

essential aspect of being human) to choose whether God will be at the centre of our lives or not.

The Bible offers different ways of describing sin:

a spirit of independence: we don't want God to interfere with our lives, preferring our own ideas, plans and ways of behaviour.

ignoring the Maker's instructions: if you ignore user instructions, you only have yourself to blame when things go wrong! God created us to function with Him at the centre of our lives.

missing the mark: we fail an exam even when we miss the pass mark by one mark: 'All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God' (Romans 3:23).

In a famous correspondence in *The Times* under the title 'What's wrong with the world?' GK Chesterton's letter simply said: 'Dear Sir, I am.'




