From the Rector

I am delighted to be starting this new phase of ministry here in Killyman.

Around twenty years ago, I served as curate in Derryloran parish

under Canon Norman Porteus. Later, from 2007 to 2013, I was rector of a small group of parishes near Downpatrick.

In 2014, Rebekah and I went to East Asia to work with 'returnee' students. By 'returnees' we mean East Asian students who have come to faith in Christ while studying in the West.

After coming back to Northern Ireland in 2018, we were involved in outreach and discipling work with East Asian students in Belfast. Rebekah continues to be involved in this ministry, both online and in person.

To have the opportunity to exercise the ministry of Word and Sacrament is a tremendous privilege.

It is an awe-inspiring thought that the Creator of the universe, infinite in all perfections, has spoken to us in the Scriptures.



Most important of all, we can know the way to heaven.

God's commandments – especially, perhaps, the Sermon on the Mount - challenge us about our sin, and help us to be sorry for it.

While the Gospel, declared week by week in Word and Sacrament, offers free forgiveness, through the blood of Christ, to everyone who feels the weight of their failure before God.

In the coming months, I hope to meet many of you personally, to read the Bible with you in your homes, and to pray with you for your needs and those of your families.

As we begin this new chapter together, I would ask for your prayers – especially for wisdom to know how to apply the Scriptures week by week. Let us pray that we will grow together in 'the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord...' (Colossians 1 v 9-10)

The Scouts have been taking their Promise seriously and as a Challenge Scouts for the King's Coronation they for the King's Coronation they wrapped up some pot plants and




which were then delivered to those who are not out and about so much.

Thinking Towards 200


In November 2024, we will celebrate the 200th Anniversary of St Andrew's Parish Church.

Brownies were registered officially in 1948 so are celebrating 75 happy years this year.


