From the Rector

Whether we live in the countryside, or in a more urban setting, we can appreciate the variety of birds outside our windows. Recently, on the cover

of a small book about the parables, I noticed a beautiful picture of birds nesting in a tree – illustrating the parable of the mustard seed, and how that seed becomes a tree large enough for the birds of the air to come and nest in its branches.

Jesus was fond of talking about birds. He used the birds to teach his disciples not to be anxious about their life, particularly about food and clothing. If God cares for the ravens, will he not also care for his disciples' day to day needs? 'Of how much more value are you than the birds!'

In similar language, in another place, Jesus said: 'Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father ... Fear not, therefore, you are of more value than many sparrows.'

Remarkably, on that occasion, Jesus had only just warned his disciples that they would face intense persecution from kings and governors, and that some would even be delivered over to death. That seems like a strange kind of protection!

But Jesus had a larger picture in mind. One day his disciples would appear before God's heavenly court.

Yes, his disciples would face great difficulties in this world, and from an earthly perspective might lose everything. But in the larger scheme of things, they would be the winners. 'Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it,' said Jesus. 'All who acknowledge me before others, I also will acknowledge before my Father in heaven.'

We will, most likely, not be dragged before courts and kings and governors, but, confessing Christ as our Saviour and Lord, we will face opposition.

Jesus understands our weakness. He sets before us the prospect of a reward to encourage us. If we confess him before others, he will acknowledge us as his own, giving us honour before his heavenly Father.

Recently, the great sporting events of summer have been taking place — Wimbledon, the Open Golf, Ashes Tests, the Women's Football World Cup, and the Tour de France. For a few brief minutes the champions walk across a stage to huge acclaim and applause, and receive glittering prizes. How much greater honour for us to be acknowledged by our Saviour, before his Father and the holy angels!

A planning team has been formed to organise events.



Did you know that there are 18 species of bat in the UK and 8 or 9 of them are found in Northern Ireland?

And did you know that these bats make up almost a quarter of ALL our mammal species?

With a wingspan of 12cm, Leisler's bat is our biggest species weighing in at around 15 grams, less than a packet of crisps.

Our smallest bat, the pipistrelle, can eat around 3,500 small insects, such as midges, in one night. Bats make great guests at any barbecue!

Bats and their roosts are protected by law throughout Ireland and Great Britain. This means that bats should not be disturbed at any time no matter where they are. Roosts are also protected at all times regardless of whether bats are present or absent.

Anyone in Northern Ireland wishing to carry out work on any structure which may interfere with the bats or their roost should first contact the <u>Northern Ireland</u> <u>Environment Agency</u> for guidance. If bats are discovered during works, all activity should cease until advice is sought from the Northern Ireland Environment Agency.

What to do if you find a bat

If you find a bat on the ground, or in an exposed area, especially during the day, is likely to need help.

How can I help?

Please follow the instructions on next page! We would appreciate it if you can submit your record (even if the bat flies away successfully) through our <u>online form</u> at www.bats-ni@org.uk.

If the bat is on the ground, on an outside wall, or in an exposed area where it may be vulnerable, you should should first try to contain it in a box before attempting to release or rescue it.



Grounded common pipistrelle

Please don't assume the bat is healthy and leave it outside to fly away.

A grounded bat is likely to need urgent care!

Contain the bat

You should avoid handling the bat, but if it is necessary WEAR GLOVES AND USE A TEA TOWEL TO LIFT THE BAT

You will need:

- A shoe box, with holes punched in the lid (or container of equivalent size)
- A cloth or teatowel
- A plastic bottle cap (milk bottle tops are perfect)
- 1. Move the bat into the shoe box or box either:-
- a) Like a spider, by placing a box on top of it and sliding a piece of card underneath...

Or:-

- b) Alternatively, cover the bat with a cloth/teatowel and carefully scoop it up and place it in the box. (You should not handle the bat with bare hands.)
- 2. Put a tea towel or soft cloth in the box for the bat to hide in.
- 3. Put in a small, shallow container e.g. a plastic milk bottle top with **a few drops of water** (not enough for the bat to drown in). Make sure the water is topped up regularly.
- 4. Keep the bat indoors somewhere quiet and dark, not anywhere too warm or too cold (a garage or shed is usually perfect).

Well done, the bat is now contained!

Even if there are no signs of injury or you dont think a cat attacked the bat, the bat may be sluggish and weak. Most grounded bats end up in this state as they are dehydrated, hungry or sick. A healthy bat should be very energetic and trying to escape! If the bat is sluggish do not attempt to release it as it will either not fly or attempt to fly and crash land. In this case please fill out our online form at www.bats-ni.org.uk and a member of CEDaR/NIEA or one of our volunteers should contact you to collect the bat or give you further advice.

What does the Bat Group do?

Volunteers carry out a number of activities including:

- Rescue and rehabilitation of bats
- Providing advice about bats to individuals, businesses and councils
- Collecting and collating bat records from across Northern Ireland which are passed on to CEDaR
- Delivering bat talks and walks to groups of all ages
- Cooperating in bat conservation and research projects including Bat Conservation Trust's National Bat Monitoring Programme
- Providing 'Bats a Fact' education resource and workshops for schools (on request)
- Providing training for members wishing to apply for a Volunteer Roost Visitor License

It doesn't seem so long since I last wrote to you. Things here have been very busy. We celebrated Pentecost with activities in all the churches.




We have replaced the roof on St Peter's and all our outreach work continues in the 3 churches.

Do you love your smartphone too much?

How much time a day do you spend on your smartphone? According to one app monitoring firm, App Annie, we can spend an average of 4.8 hours a day on it. And so much time is not doing us any good.

As one writer has put it, our smartphone "removes us from the present moment and wastes time that could be more profitably and purposefully spent. Imagine, at the end of your life, receiving a balance sheet stating the number of your hours on Earth lost to scrolling."

Scientists explain the attraction of smartphones in this way: responding to the 'push notification' rewards you with dopamine, the brain chemical that makes you happy.

"The smartphone is the modern-day hypodermic needle, delivering digital dopamine 24/7 for a wired generation," Dr Anna Lembke, professor of psychiatry and behavioural sciences at Stanford University, California, wrote in her book *Dopamine Nation* in 2021.

Dr Lembke warns: "The scrolling and visual stimuli release dopamine in our brain's reward pathways, and the way our brain compensates for overstimulation is [by entering] a dopamine deficit state. Once we're in that state we continue scrolling to try and bring those dopamine levels back up to baseline, so we get into a place where we're chasing our tail. We're chasing dopamine."

Being bored is good for you!

This will cheer you up this summer, when your children mope around the house saying that they are bored: apparently a bit of boredom is *good* for them.

So says a senior educationalist, Julia Robinson, who has encouraged parents NOT to force their children into too many activities. Instead,

they must be allowed to become bored, so that they can have time to be reflective and calm. Too many pursuits such as music lessons, sport and online learning could result in a generation of manic, anxiety-ridden adults, she warns. She points out that happiness does not come from a "regime of unrealistic multitasking, running oneself ragged with an exhausting programme of endless...activities."

Another educationalist urged that children need "downtime.... They have the right to be bored, to give them the stimulus to be inventive, resourceful and self-reliant – all important life skills."







400 years ago, on 6th August 1623 that Anne Hathaway died. She was William Shakespeare's wife.

125 years ago, on 23rd August 1898 that the British Antarctic Expedition set off from London and became the first to spend winter on the Antarctic mainland and cross the Ross Ice Shelf. It was the first British expedition of the Heroic Age of Antarctic Exploration. The expedition returned to London in June 1900.

100 years ago, on 29th August 1923 that Richard Attenborough, British film actor and director was born. Best known for his roles in *The Great Escape*, and *Jurassic Park*. He also directed films including *A Bridge Too Far, Cry Freedom* and *Gandhi*. Died 2014.

80 years ago, on 17th & 18th August 1943 that the RAF bombed the Peenemunde V1/V2 rocket research centre in Germany, in the first air raid of Operation Crossbow. The raid caused 'severe damage'.

Also 80 years ago, on 25th August 1943 that British Admiral Lord Louis Mountbatten became Supreme Allied Commander South East Asia.

75 years ago, on 23rd August 1948 that the World Council of Churches was founded in Amsterdam.

70 years ago, on 21st August 1953 that the UK premiere of the romantic comedy film *Roman Holiday* took place. It featured Audrey Hepburn in her first starring role.

65 years ago, on 29th August 1958 that Cliff Richard's first single *Move It* was released. It reached second place in the UK charts, and John Lennon would later call it "the first British rock record".

60 years ago, on 8th August 1963 that the Great Train Robbery took place on the West Coast Main Line at Ledburn, Buckinghamshire. £2.6million was stolen in one of the UK's most infamous robberies. The bulk of the money was never recovered. Also 60 years ago, on 28th August 1963 that Dr Martin Luther King Jr, delivered his famous 'I Have a Dream' speech from the steps of the Lincoln Memorial during the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom. The civil rights rally was attended by approximately 200,000 supporters.

25 years ago, on 15th August 1998 that a car bomb in Omagh, Northern Ireland, killed 29 people and injured 370. It was the deadliest act of violence in the 30-year history of the Troubles.

20 years ago, on 11th August 2003 that NATO took over the command of the international peacekeeping force in Kabul, Afghanistan. It was its first major operation outside of Europe.
