

#### From the Rector

As we prepare to celebrate Christ's first coming this Christmas, let us also look beyond our own time to His second coming.

The Nicene Creed says:

'He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead ... We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.'

Its' easy to recite those words during a church service without thinking much about what they mean; but they are of great importance, for they refer to the eternal future that is given to all who trust in Jesus' promise.

So, what should we look forward to?

On Christ's return, the souls of believers who have already died will be reunited with their bodies. In fact, we will be clothed with a glorified body.

This glorified body will be recognisably 'us', yet wonderfully different and new. In some way, in our glorified state, we will be like Christ. 'Beloved, now we are children of God; and it has not yet been revealed what we shall be, but we know that when He is revealed, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is.' (1 John 3 v 2)

We shall be like Christ, not only in glory, but also in holiness. Every taint of sin will be removed from us. Do we wish to be like Christ in this way? John continues the above verse as follows: 'And everyone who has this hope in him purifies himself, just as He is pure.' (1 John 3 v 2)

We will join in something that is likened to a banquet. (Revelation 19 v 7 - 9) We will enter a time of great joy in the presence of Christ, and all His faithful servants.

Already, in union with Christ we have become part of this company that transcends the ages, and we begin to enjoy the communion of saints. (Hebrews  $12 ext{ v } 22 - 24$ ) But, when Christ returns, space, time and death will no longer present barriers to the full realisation of this fellowship.

We will receive a heavenly dwelling place, or 'mansion'. Christ says He has gone to prepare such places for His disciples. Each abode will be perfectly suited to the unique personality of each saint. (John 14 v 2 - 3)

And, we shall see God. 'Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God.' (Matthew 5 v 8) Having been made perfectly holy, with no more taint of sin in our souls, we will enjoy the vision of God. This is a great mystery. We will have perfect communion with God, for He will dwell with us. He will be our God and we shall be His people. (Revelation 21 v 3)

Finally, we can say that all tears shall be wiped away. There shall be no more death or anything to make us afraid. There will be no hunger or thirst or darkness. God himself will be our light-giving sun and moon, and Christ the Lamb will feed us and lead us to fountains of living water. (Revelation  $7 ext{ v } 16 - 17$ )

May God help us to trust in this promise of eternal life, paid for by the blood of his Son; and may the assurance of our heavenly future strengthen and encourage us to meet the challenges that each new day brings.

#### A prayer for Killyman parish as we enter the 200th year of the current Church building:

'Hear us, most merciful God,
for that part of the Church which thou hast planted in our land,
that it may hold fast the faith which thou gavest unto the Saints,
and in the end bear much fruit to eternal life;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.'

Recent research has found that drinking coffee or tea in midlife may help keep you stronger in later life.

A study at the National University of Singapore concluded that higher caffeine intake is associated with lower odds of physical frailty in old age, re-

gardless of the source of the caffeine.

Physical frailty in old age was defined as having at least two of the following: weight loss, exhaustion, slowness and weakness. The scientists also measured handgrip strength and the time taken to complete a timed up-and-go (TUG) test.

In addition to caffeine, coffee and tea contain rich bioactive polyphenols, which have antioxidant and anti-inflammatory properties. These have been associated with reduced risk for diseases that increase frailty, such as diabetes, cardiovascular diseases, obesity and neurodegenerative disease.




