From the Rector

It seems no time at all since Christmas, and already we are counting down to Easter. Once again, our minds return to the heart of the gospel - 'the old, old,

story' of which we should never tire.

earth.

The account of what happened between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday is by far the largest section in each of the four gospels. From the Gospel writers' point of view, Jesus' death and resurrection were what Jesus had to pass through to achieve what he came to earth to accomplish.

Jesus came to make it possible for people to enter and inherit the kingdom of heaven. He came to offer the free gift of eternal life to all who believe in him - to 'open the kingdom of heaven to all believers' (Te Deum). And he died and rose again to bring that about.

This is summarised in the words of the apostle Paul: 'Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures ... he was buried ... and he rose again the third day according to the Scriptures.' (1 Corinthians 15 v 3-4) And our Lord said just as much in his own words, while he was here on

'This is my blood of the covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins.' (Matthew 26 v 28)

God 'hates nothing that he has made.' He loved the world and wanted to save the world. And so, it came about that the Son was lifted up on the cross, for the world, 'that whoever believes in him should not perish but have everlasting life.' (John 3 v 16)

This is the 'old, old, story'. On the first Easter, Christ died and rose again so that we would not perish. He died to give the right to become children of God to all who believe in his name. (John 1 v 12)

So, this Easter, let us be sure that our faith is in him and him alone for eternal life. Relying on him, we can be sure that we will never perish. And that assurance of our eternal salvation can be the bedrock of our lives. 'My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. And I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of my hand.' (John $10 \vee 27 - 28$)

A prayer for Killyman parish as we celebrate the 200th year of the current Church building:

'Hear us, most merciful God,
for that part of the Church which thou hast planted in our land,
that it may hold fast the faith which thou gavest unto the Saints,
and in the end bear much fruit to eternal life;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.'


Sunday School for Primary 1-Primary 7 pupils meets each Sunday morning in the Parish Hall from 10:30am-11:15am.

General Vestry Register


Register of Vestry persons will be open during the month of February.

Registration forms are available from the Churchwardens and should be returned to them by 29th February 2024.






Mary and Joseph Advent 2023

Thank you to everyone who hosted Mary and Joseph.



What lessons can Christians learn from a London rail worker who was recently honoured by King Charles, for talking 29 people out of taking their own lives?

Maybe something about the power of conversation and being willing to 'stop for a chat.'

Rizwan Javed helped to save each life over a period of eight years, by being alert and approaching vulnerable individuals in difficult situations. He was awarded an MBE in the New Year Honours earlier this year. Rizwan was alert, and willing to engage people in conversation.

Anglican priest Jemima Prasadam's style of talking with people has been described as 'bus stop theology.' She put it into action on the half-mile walk from her home to the church in Lozells, an inner-city area of West Birmingham, with high unemployment and poverty.

Her engaging approach is featured in *Stick with Love*, a recent book by Arun Arora, Bishop of Kirkstall in northern England.

She explained: "I don't go out looking to talk to people, but I am ready to do it. I don't pass anybody without saying 'Hello' and when I leave, I always say 'God bless you.' Meetings happen on a daily basis, but often only last as long as it takes for the bus to arrive.

"People often say they are not religious, but I say we are all spiritual beings, and they agree. So, I simply tell them that weak and simple people like me call that God."

Sadly, we are living in a society where conversations are being closed down. People who might have chatted on the bus or train, are now deeply involved with their mobile phones.

Supermarkets are phasing out staffed checkout points, so that elderly people and others who live alone are deprived of those conversations that can make a difference to their day.

Jesus asked questions as a vital component of His earthly ministry. His deep conversation with the Samaritan woman at the well in John 4 begins with Him asking for a drink.

Maybe we, as Christians and churches, need to be looking out for more chances to start conversations, to give people the opportunity to open up about their lives. In our busy, rushing-around world, there are many people out there who are just longing for a chat...



















Mission Update from PERU
